Minister announces beautification of beaches with Rs. 100 crore in five years, Olympic academies

Chennai, Sept 5: The Tamil Nadu government will spend Rs 100 crore over a five-year period to beautify its beaches to get a blue flag certificate, said Siva V. Meyyanathan, state Minister for Environment, Climate Change and Youth Welfare and Sports Development.

While making announcements Siva V. Meyyanathan, Minister for Environment-Climate Change said, The Marina beach will be beautified at a cost of Rs. 20 crore for Blue Flag Certification. Two other beaches in the State will be beautified at a cost of Rs. 10 crore each in 2021-22, also for the Blue Flag Certification.

A 'Green Champion' award with a cash prize of Rs 1 crore will be started for individuals and institutions engaged in environment protection, the minister added.

Announcing this in the state Assembly while presenting the demand for grants, Meyyanathan said the beautification of the Kovalam beach at an outlay of Rs 10 crore to qualify for a blue flag certificate is currently

being done.

During the fiscal year 2021-22, two beaches in the state will be cleaned and beautified at an outlay of Rs 20 crore, he added.

Similarly, over a period of five years a sum of Rs 100 crore will be spent to clean and beautify several beaches in the state.

Meyyanathan said the state pollution control board will issue consent letters to industries to operate for more than one year.

According to him, the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board will be modernised at an outlay of Rs 32 crore.

Olympic academy
Sports Minister Meyyanathan said, "The State government has decided to set up four Olympic academies in four zones.

"It has been decided that experts will be appointed to prepare a techno-economic feasibility report," the Minister said.

He said the government was taking steps to provide 3% reservation to silambam players in government jobs. He said the Nehru Indoor Stadium in Coimbatore would be repaired at a cost of Rs. 50 lakh.

Common effluent treatment plants

Common effluent treatment plants (CETPs) would be established in 10 locations in Erode and Namakkal districts to prevent discharge of effluents from industries into water bodies, minister for environment and climate change Siva V Meyyanathan informed the state assembly on Friday. The CETPs would be established with state and Central funding, Meyyanathan said in reply to the debate on demands for grants for various departments.

The move is expected to prevent pollution of Cauvery in Erode and Namakkal districts. Scores of dyeing units

are functioning along the banks of the river at Komarapalayam, Pallapalayam and Kokkarayanpettai in Erode and Namakkal districts. Several of these units do not have effluent treatment facilities and illegally discharge chemical waste into the river during night hours.

At present, there are 37 CETPs in the state of which 13 are in the tannery sector while 19 have been installed for textile bleaching and dyeing units. Emphasising the importance of CETP, the minister asked the industries to install CETPs to safeguard the environment.

The minister said the TNPCB has also taken measures to check the water quality in the water bodies in textile industrial belts of Tirupur, Erode, and Namakkal districts. It installed three online continuous water quality monitors in river Cauvery, Noyyal, Bhavani and

Kalingarayan canal in the region to monitor the water quality on a real-time basis. The facility also covers Thamirabarani in Tirumelveli district.

Air quality monitors

Apart from this, the department had installed 34 continuous ambient air quality (AAQ) monitoring stations to check the air quality in industrial areas and cities, the minister said and noted that the system would alert whenever the AAQ pollution level goes beyond the permissible level. The officials would act immediately and take appropriate action.

Now, the government has decided to install AAQ monitoring stations in all district headquarters and in towns that have more than 1 lakh population, he added.

There were 50,650 industries in the state. The Central Pollution Control Board has categorised the highly polluting industries as Red (12,722 industries), medium polluting industries as Orange (26,739) and less polluting industries as Green (11,169) based on the pollution index score. The department has brought 177 highly polluting industries in the state under intensive monitoring, he noted.

Forest Minister announces emergency clinics, rehabilitation centres for wild animals

Chennai, Sept 5: Forests Minister K. Ramachandran announced in the Assembly that emergency clinics and rehabilitation centres for wild animals injured while moving out of forests would be established in Coimbatore, Tirumelveli and Tiruchi.

Replying to the demand for grants for his Department, the Minister said a new elephant camp would be set up

in Agathiyarmalai for better management of Asian elephants. "The camp will cover elephants in Kanniyakumari, Tirumelveli and Tenkasi districts," he said.

Sanctuary for sea cows
Another announcement made by him was of the establishment of a sanctuary for sea cows in the Gulf of Mammur and the Palk Straits, and a dog squad to prevent poaching and felling of

trees in forest areas. "Native breed dogs will be used in the squad," the Minister said.

The Minister said the Marine Elite Force, to be set up in the State, would prevent the poaching of marine species.

Ramachandran also announced that the government would come out with a new policy to eradicate invasive plant species such as Lantana and Juliflora.

Power market achieves 74% growth

Chennai, Sept 5: Indian Energy Exchange (IEX) said the electricity market achieved a new milestone with a record all-time high monthly volume of 9,538 million units in August, achieving 74 per cent year-on-year growth.

The national peak demand at 196 GW saw an increase of 17 per cent while energy consumption at 129.51 BU also grew 17 per cent.

On one hand, growth in the economic and industrial activities led to the increase in demand for power.

On the other hand, supply side constraints like high cost of imported coal and LNG as well as lower wind power generation led to increase in electricity prices discovered on the exchange.

New IT rules do not violate any right: Centre tells High Court

Chennai, Sept 5: The newly enacted Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules, 2021, do not violate any right guaranteed under the Constitution or any provision of the parent Information Technology Act, the Central

government stated in its counter-affidavits filed in the Madras High Court, on Friday.

The counters were filed in response to a batch of PIL pleas from musician TM Krishna, the Digital News Publishers Association, consisting of 13 media outlets and another

individual, challenging the constitutional validity of the rules. The counters denied all the contentions of the petitioners. The Bench of Chief Justice Sanjib Banerjee and Justice P D Audikesavulu adjourned hearing on the matter till September 14.

CPCL produces highest quantity of food grade hexane

Chennai, Sept 5: The Chennai Petroleum Corporation Ltd. (CPCL) refinery at Manali near the city has produced highest quantity of food grade hexane so far in 2020-21. It has produced 22,500 tonnes, surpassing its own previous record of 19,700 tonnes in 2019-20.

CPCL, which has the capacity to produce 25,000 tonnes of hexane per annum, is a group company of Indian Oil Corporation Ltd. Hexane is produced from naphtha during the refining process by a two-stage distillation. After it is separated from naphtha, a de-aromatization is done

to remove aromatic compounds. It is in liquid form and its boiling point is between 63 degree Celsius and 70 degree Celsius.

Around 70% of the hexane that the refinery produces is supplied to manufacturers who use it as a solvent to extract edible oil from seeds, including soya.
